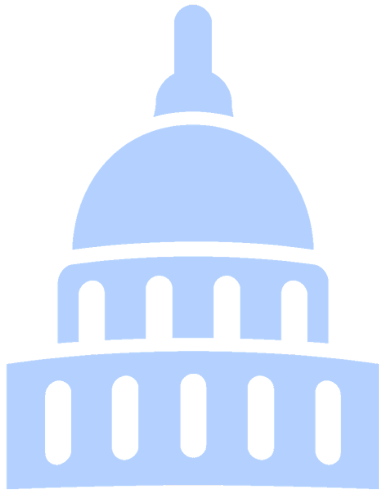

To support the operations of the U.S. House and Senate, increase security and protection, and ensure functional congressional support agencies

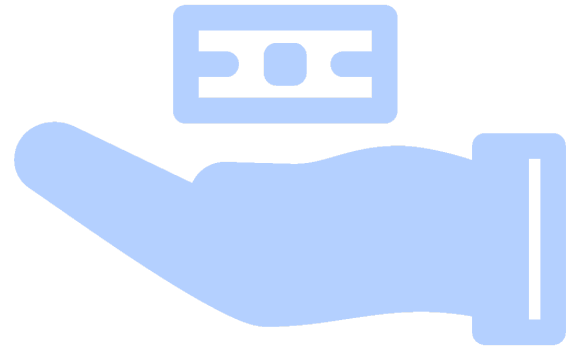


## PRIORITIZING SAFETY AT THE CAPITOL

- Supports critical safety and enhanced security for all Members, staff, and visitors of the Capitol Complex by providing **\$426.5M**, an increase of **\$33.2M** above FY17, for the Capitol Police
- Includes **\$7.5M** for Capitol Police and **\$5M** for the Sergeant-at-Arms to enhance security for Members both in Washington, DC, and in congressional districts
- Provides **\$712M** for the Architect of the Capitol to make essential health and safety improvements to aging or damaged facilities in the Capitol Complex
- Enhances cybersecurity throughout congressional agencies

## ADVANCING RESPONSIBILITY IN CONGRESS

- Provides **\$4M** for mandatory training requirements for all Members and staff on workplace rights
- Funds the creation of the Office of Employee Advocacy, which will provide an advocate for House employees in proceedings before the Office of Compliance and Committee on Ethics
- Continues the Government Accountability Office's critical oversight work by providing **\$579M** in funding
- Directs the Congressional Research Service to make available all non-confidential CRS products on a website
- Funding for the House has been reduced by **12.34%** since FY10



## MAINTAINING THE FUNCTIONS OF CONGRESS

- Funds the operations of the U.S. House at **\$1.2B**
- Supports our wounded warriors by including **\$2.75M** for fellowships for wounded veterans, providing 31 additional fellowships to the current 54 two-year positions
- Provides **\$669M** for the Library of Congress, which will enhance public exhibits and visitor services, and support information technology modernization for the Library, the Copyright Office, and the Congressional Research Service
