

Senate Amendment to H.R. 2157, the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2019

\$19.1 billion in assistance for several natural disasters in fiscal years 2017 through 2019

- **Agriculture - \$5.3 BILLION** - This amount includes \$3 billion for agricultural crop and livestock losses, \$558 million for farmland rehabilitation, \$480 million for forest restoration, \$150 million for rural community facilities, and \$435 million for watershed and flood prevention to address Midwest flooding.
- **Military and Veterans - \$2.7 BILLION** - The bill includes funds to repair military and veterans' facilities severely damaged by hurricanes and floods.
- **Puerto Rico** - The bill removes language included in H.R. 2157, as passed by the House, that would have waived the FEMA cost-share for Puerto Rico at a price tag of \$5 billion to American taxpayers.
- **Commerce, Justice, Science - \$940 MILLION** - This amount includes \$600 million for infrastructure and economic recovery, \$150 million for fishery disasters, and \$146 million for National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration operations and procurement, including funds to repair facilities and improve weather forecasting.
- **Energy and Water - \$3.3 BILLION** - This amount includes \$3.26 billion for U.S. Army Corps of Engineers civil works projects and \$15.5 million for repairs of Bureau of Reclamation projects.
- **Homeland Security - \$526 MILLION** - The bill provides \$526 million for operations and repairs of Coast Guard assets.
- **Interior and Environment - \$1.6 BILLION** - This amount includes \$414 million for clean water and drinking water infrastructure and environmental clean-up, \$720 million for wildland fire suppression repayment, and \$446 million for repairs and clean-up on public lands and insular areas.
- **Labor, Health, and Education - \$611 MILLION** - The bill provides \$611 million for employment, mental health, health care, and education programs.
- **Transportation and Housing - \$4.1 BILLION** - This amount includes \$2.4 billion for the Community Development Block Grant and \$1.7 billion for the Federal Highway Administration.
